


KEEP THIS CARD HANDY IN YOUR CAR, CAMPER, OR BOAT

What to do if you receive an emergency alert



Berrien County uses IPAWS wireless emergency alerts, B-WARN! alerts, and alerts over TV or radio broadcasts to let you know when a serious emergency is happening. B-WARN! is our backup notification system if IPAWS does not work, so we strongly encourage you to sign up for B-WARN!. Follow the sign-up directions below.

If you receive an alert

Tune to one of the radio or TV stations listed below, or check your cell phone or other wireless communication device for emergency messages.

FOLLOW ALL BROADCAST INSTRUCTIONS PROMPTLY.
The radio or TV announcer will tell you what actions you should take, if any.

Emergency alert information for vacationers and visitors



Vacationers & Visitors

If you receive an emergency alert while vacationing or visiting the area, follow the instructions included in the alert. If you are outdoors, seek shelter indoors. Tune to one of the TV or radio stations listed on the other side of this card for more detailed information. Follow all directions given by park officials, sheriff and police officers.

Boaters & Campers

If you receive an emergency alert while boating, do not wait for further warning. Tune to marine channel 16 (156.8 MHz) or an area AM/FM radio station listed on the other side of this card for emergency information. Marine patrol boats also warn boaters on Lake Michigan if there is a serious emergency. You will be told the location of safe waterways and docking areas.

If you receive an emergency alert while camping, hiking, swimming, or visiting area parks, follow all emergency instructions from park officials. At Warren Dunes and Grand Mere state parks, officials will use the public address system or mobile alert units to let you know what to do. At other local parks, immediately tune to an area radio station listed on the other side and follow instructions.

YOUR SAFETY MATTERS.

Berrien County has an Emergency Plan to handle serious emergencies. Area federal, state, county, and local officials, media, and Cook Nuclear Plant personnel conduct regularly scheduled drills and exercises to make sure you will stay safe while visiting our area.
